विषय: राष्ट्रीय वाश सम्मि 16-18 फरवरी 2015- राज्य सरकारों की भागीदारी के संबंध में।

महोदय/महोदया,

वापर ऐड इण्डिया, पेयजल एवं स्वच्छता मंत्रालय और शहरी विकास मंत्रालय के सहयोग से नई दिल्ली में 16-18 फरवरी, 2015 के बीच एक 3 दिवसीय राष्ट्रीय कश सम्मि का योजन कर रही है। सम्मि के उद्देश्य है:-

(क) स्वच्छ भारत मिशन (ग्रामीण) पर ध्यान केंद्रित करने के साथ भारत के कश एजेंडा को गे ले जाते हुए विद्यमान और ने वाले कार्यक्रम तक पहुँच बनाना, जिसके तहत निम्न पर ध्यान दिया जाता है:-

- I. स्वच्छता संदेशों के माध्यम से निरंतरता
- II. ग्रामीण और शहरी क्षेत्रों में कश सेवाओं में एक से मॉडल
- III. जल सुरक्षा और जल गुणवत्ता पर दृष्टिपात
- IV. प्रभावशाली ठोस और तरल अपशिष्ट प्रबंधन

(ख) एसबीएम के तर्ज पर जल एवं स्वच्छता पर विशेषज्ञता बांने और अभिनष मॉडलों को तैयार करने में कश विशेषज्ञों के साथ भागीदारी

(ग) समाधान खोजने और कार्य के मूर्त योजनाओं को अंतिम रूप देने में संसाधनों और लीडरशिप को साथ लाना।

राज्य सरकारों को इस सम्मि में भाग लेने का अनुरोध किया गया। यह प्रस्ताव है कि राज्य में ग्रामीण स्वच्छता के प्रधान सचिव/प्रभारी और स्वच्छ भारत मिशन के राज्य समन्वयनकर्ता कार्यक्रम में भाग लेते है। कार्यक्रम का एक संकल्पना नो सूचना हेतु संलग्न है।

Concept note for India WASH Summit: Solutions to Swachh Bharat Mission

February 16-18, 2015

Venue: India International Center, New Delhi

WaterAid India

Water Aid India, planning in collaboration with the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation (MDWS) and the Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD), will be conducting a three day national WASH summit from 16th-18th February, 2015.

The Objectives for this summit include:

- 1) Assess existing and upcoming programs in taking forward India's WASH agenda, with a focus on Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM). Addressing:
 - Sustainability through hygiene messages
 - Replicable models in WASH services in rural and urban areas
 - Approaches in water security and water quality
 - Effective solid and liquid waste management
- 2) Partner with WASH professionals in sharing expertise and building innovative models in water and sanitation, in line with SBM
- 3) Bring resources and leadership together in finding solutions and finalizing concrete plans of action

Background

The WASH agenda in India continues to be critical. For the first time ever, a national WASH summit is being organized to bring attention to this, and to work towards finding long-term sustainable solutions. There is sound evidence that improving water, sanitation, and hygiene issues is central to ensuring the rights of the rural and urban poor. Many programs in the WASH area are addressing this. This summit aims to bring these programs together further, as well as encourage ingenuity in new approaches, to bring the impact to the desired scale.

About WASH Summit

This summit will bring together relevant WASH stakeholders over three days to share experiences and ideas on eliminating open defecation and ensure usable and functional facilities by 2019, in line with Prime Minister Modi's Swachh Bharat Mission. International NGOs, inter-government agencies, corporates and representatives from the state and central governments, as well as WaterAid will be at the summit. The summit will work to mobilize these stakeholders to work together to evolve a strategy for effective and speedy implementation on a large scale. Identifying possible areas of resource mobilization and future collaboration is key for this. Participants will present technical papers on sanitation, hygiene and water. There is a possibility of forming initial links between donors and NGOs for funding, as both will be present in the summit. Approximately 300 people are expected to attend the summit.
