Subject: Engagement of Key Resource Centres (KRCs) for trainings

Sir/Madam,

You are aware that after the launch of Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin), an increased focus is given to building capacities of implementing agencies and all the stakeholders. The Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation had empanelled certain KRCs to help the States with such trainings. After an evaluation by UNICEF, certain deficiencies were noted in the system of providing such trainings. These included, mainly, lack of coordination between the KRCs and States, mismatch between the nature of training demanded by the States and the one supplied by the KRCs, and absence of any forward linkages to engage the participants trained through KRCs.

2. The system is, therefore, being reformed, and a series of regional conclaves, inviting the States' representatives and the KRCs have been held, to bring about better coordination between States and the KRCs. In these conclaves, the States were requested to send a list of such organisations, as they desire to engage for further capacity building activities in the States. These organisations are now being given training and their skills upgraded through UNICEF. It is expected that after these trainings, these organisations will be able to better facilitate trainings in the States, especially those related to community approaches in sanitation. The first such training was held at Champavat, Uttarakhand from December 4 to 8, 2015. The State-wise list, of organisations, that have received training so far, is enclosed as Annexure-I for further information.

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- 3. The Government of India (GoI) has also in place funding norms for payment of KRCs. These are at Annexure II.
- 4. The States may now consider to engage the organisations trained through UNICEF for further scaling up the capacity building programmes. The States may also like to consider using the GoI norms for payment of these organisations. The expenditure on these trainings can be borne from the IEC component of SBM-G.
- 5. Since training through UNICEF/GoI is a continuous process, you are requested to nominate the remaining organisations for training. Nominations may be sent to Shri Neeraj Tewari, Consultant, HR at the e-mail neerajtewari70@gmail.com. You are also welcome to suggest more organisations, which the State desires to be trained through GoI/UNICEF.
