Sir,

In pursuance of directives issued by National Disaster Management Authority regarding Impending South-West Monsoon from June to Sep., States/UTs have to take steps for preparedness and response in order to tackle the impending Flood and Cyclone situations in respect of maintaining Rural Water Supply. A list of States / UTs prone to Floods & Cyclone is enclosed.

States/UTs are required to prepare their own contingency plans for mitigation of such situations. States/UTs may utilize the 15% O&M funds already available with them under NRDWP. This fund can be utilized by States for water supply system affected by Floods/Cyclone. In case of disruption of Rural Water Supply due to Flood/Cyclone, Water supply through Water Tankers and other means may also be carried out using 10% Flexi funds under NRDWP.

In such a situation, States/UTs may like to depute JEs/other field staff from nonaffected areas to affected areas for immediate help and restoration works. Please create a toll free number in the office of CE / Engineering-in-Chief and inform the number to all DCs, SEs, EEs and BDOs. This facility should be working on 24x7 basis. The situation may be reported to MDWS and Area Officer in the Ministry related to your State.
