Subject: Coverage of Piped Water Supply with at least 40 LPCD in ODF verified villages

Madam / Sir,

Please refer to this Ministry letters of even number dated 29.06.2015 conveying that no new projects should be taken up in the States. However, some exceptions were given vide this letter and subsequently vide letter of even no. dated 19.02.2016 and No.W-11011/21/2015/Water-I (Part-I) dated 08.02.2016. These three letters are enclosed for ready reference.

2. It has now been decided that States / UTs may take up new Piped Water Supply Schemes for coverage of at least 40 LPCD in the villages which have been verified as Open Defecation Free (ODF). State wise numbers of such villages / habitations mentioning the status of coverage of Piped Water Supply / 40 LPCD as on 25.05.2016 is enclosed. The names of villages which are 'ODF verified' may be obtained from the link (Format F-42) as under:


3. States are hereby requested to initiate actions for Piped Water Supply / 40 LPCD in such ODF verified villages immediately on priority to provide the coverage by March 2018 positively.

4. As the figures of ODF is continuously increasing, States must follow the said link regularly to know the villages which are becoming 'ODF verified' and to take necessary actions on priority for coverage (with rural water supply in similar way) in time bound manner, say within one year of becoming ODF verified.


Recently the Ministry has released the first instalment of National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP) funds for the financial year 2015 - 16 for all the States under Programme, Water Quality Monitoring & Surveillance and Support components.

2. As reported by you recently, there are a large number of on-going projects in different States (list enclosed). Accordingly, with the Programme funds of this year released recently as the first instalment, only these on-going projects are to be completed on priority basis. No new projects should be taken up in the State with this programme fund except in the following cases:

- (i) Short term and long term measures for fluoride and arsenic affected habitations as we have committed to cover these areas by March, 2017;
- (ii) Provision of potable drinking water in the selected Gram Panchayats under Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna (SAGY) either by taking up new schemes or through augmentation of existing schemes.
- (iii) If the State/UT has no ongoing project, the programme fund may be used for undertaking new projects.

Subject: Implementation of the Rural Water Supply Schemes under NRDWP

Madam / Sir,

Please refer to this Ministry DO letter No. W-11041/9/2015/Water-I dated 29.06.2015 conveying the instructions / direction of this Ministry for taking up on-going schemes only for implementation except in the following cases:

- Short term and long term measures for fluoride and arsenic affected habitations.
- Provision of potable drinking water in the selected Gram Panchayats under Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna (SAGY) either by taking up new schemes or through augmentation of existing schemes.
- If the State /UT has no ongoing project, the programme fund may be used for undertaking new projects.

2. The Ministry has examined various references raised during interaction with the States and it is hereby being conveyed that re-boring of hand pumps & tube wells is allowed if the existing ones have become defunct and beyond economic repair which is to be mandatorily certified by competent authority. The same is to be invariably mentioned in the brief to the State level Scheme Sanctioning Committee (SLSSC) for approval.

3. This issues with the approval of competent authority.

Dear Madam / Sir,

Kindly refer to this Ministry's letter No.W-11041/9/2015-Water.I dated 29th June, 2015 in which directions were issued to all the States with regard to the completion of ongoing projects. Subsequent to this, the Ministry has received many representations from the State Governments as well as public representatives wherein request has been made for revisiting the directions. Request has been made to this Ministry to allow the States to take up augmentation and upgradation of existing old water supply schemes under the programme in addition to completion of ongoing schemes and this work should not be barred from being taken up / execution.

2. A Committee was constituted in the Ministry to look into the issue and give suitable recommendations. The Committee deliberated on the issue and has recommended that augmentation and upgradation of existing old piped water schemes which are defunct or had outlived their useful life in many States should be allowed to be taken up under the programme component of NRDWP and this would not attract the ban on taking up any new scheme as communicated vide this Ministry's letter dated 29-06-2015.

3. The works which can be taken up under augmentation / upgradation of old functional or defunct piped water supply schemes are illustrated below:-

.....2/-

- a) Augmentation of reservoir, repair /construction of additional overhead tank .
- b) Extension of pipelines to enhance coverage.
- c) Upgradation / laying of additional parallel pipe distribution system.
- d) Works related to source improvement like additional intake works/ tube wells to cover new households.
- e) Providing additional water lifting pumps or replacement of outdated energy inefficient pumps or change of ground water based sources into surface water based sources.

4. While the focus of the Ministry would be completion of ongoing schemes and direction to the States as communicated by this Ministry's letter dated 29-06-2015 would remain in force , the States, if they so desire , may take up the augmentation and upgradation of the existing water supply schemes, after taking the approval of the State Level Scheme Sanctioning Committee (SLSSC).
