Madam/ Sir,


I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letter of even no. dated 23.06.2016 on the subject cited above (copy enclosed) and to say that as decided in the 49th NSSC meeting held on 23rd June 2016, this Ministry has open the MIS for capturing additional households details under SBM (G).

2. However, in order to keep a check on number of beneficiaries under SBM (G), an entry module (Module B 05) has been developed to allow the States to update the existing district level cap from time to time. The Districts will be able to enter beneficiary level data in MIS in B01 module upto the limit of district level cap fixed by the States. A copy of the module B05 is enclosed for ready reference.

3. It is, therefore, requested that the district level cap in MIS may be updated by the States/UTs so as to enable the districts to reflect the left out houses in MIS of SBM (G). After updating the district level cap in MIS, appropriate directions may be issued to the districts for entering additional beneficiary details.

Subject: - Opening of IMIS allowing the States/UTs to update beneficiary level data – regarding.


Madam/Sir,

The SBM (G) focusses on achievement of open defecation free (ODF) villages. When an intervention is started in an ODF village, it becomes important to address all the existing households that are without toilets, even if their name has been left out of the original baseline. Of these, those eligible for incentive as per the SBM (G) guidelines have to be provided incentive; while the remaining categories - ineligible APL, defunct, those provided subsidy earlier - have to be motivated or provided funding from other sources such as CSR, Gram Panchayat own funds, community contribution, Swachh Bharat Kosh etc as prescribed.

2. The issue of opening the IMIS for updating of beneficiary level data has been raised time and again by several States so as to enable them to reflect the actual position of sanitation coverage in the States/UTs. The SBM (G) guidelines provide for updation of this data.
3. In view of the above, the IMIS is being opened to allow updation/ correction of data. This updation may be carried out by the States/ districts to reflect the corrections as may have been necessitated due to certain households left out from baseline. The additions/ corrections are to be made with due diligence to reflect the status as is - and keeping in mind the eligibility criteria. The defunct toilets i. e. those that have been provided incentive money earlier under any sanitation programme cannot be included in the eligible category.

4. It may however be noted that the total funds released under SBM (G) will be limited to the PIPs of the respective States/UTs as approved by the NSSC.
