February, 2016

Dear Sr/Modern

There has been an unprecedented focus on sanitation in India, ever since the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, from the ramparts of Red Fort during his Independence Day address on August 15, 2014, gave a clarion call to the nation to make India clean. Half of India's population defecates in the open, a figure that is truly alarming for a country that is poised to become a global superpower. The Government is therefore trying to address this problem comprehensively and on a priority. Swachh Bharat Mission has been launched to create an open-defecation-free India by 2nd October, 2019.

- 2. The Swachh Bharat Mission provides flexibility to the States in addressing this issue. This is so, since sanitation is a State subject, and solution to various challenges in this sector requires contextual innovations appropriate to the local socio-cultural-economic milieu. While the programme provides incentives for construction of toilets, some components such as repair of defunct toilets, appropriate software activities, R&D, technological innovations etc. require additional funds. The massive scale of work more than seven crore toilets to be constructed over the next four years requires innovative financing and meaningful partnership with businesses and suppliers.
- 3. In order to deliberate upon the same, the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation is organising 'Innovative Sanitation Financing Forum' on the 9th February, 2016 at Hall no.5, Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Rural Development, Drinking Water and Sanitation & Panchayati Raj will be inaugurating the Forum.
- 4. The Forum aims to bring together policymakers and capital allocators, to brainstorm and explore opportunities for collaboration. We expect participation from the Central government and State governments, multilaterals, commercial banks, regional rural banks, scheduled co-operative banks, microfinance institutions, impact investment community, non-profits and corporates to work out a multi-pronged strategy to achieve 'Swachh Bharat'. Developing and scaling priority sector lending portfolios in water and sanitation may be a crucial first step in innovative financing. At the Forum, we can focus on how the Reserve Bank of India's inclusion of water and sanitation in its priority sector lending (PSL) guidelines in 2014 can be translated from intent into action.

- 5. At the Forum, we will also be exploring various ways in which different organisations can work with financial institutions and state governments to facilitate water and sanitation financing, especially at the household level. Given you experience in implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission (G), your experiences and insights would be valuable to all our delegates. We request you to kindly participate in the Forum along with SBM(G) coordinator.
