

**Minutes of the Video Conferencing to Review Progress of NBA held on
7th September, 2012 at New Delhi**

1. The Video Conferencing to Review Progress of NBA was held on 7th September, 2012 in the Conference Room of Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation, GoI, 12th Floor, Paryawaran Bhawan, New Delhi. It was chaired by Secretary, Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Government of India.
2. Thereafter, progress and issues were discussed State-wise. Details are as under:
 - i. **Chhattisgarh:** Achievements against AIP-2012-13 objectives are very low in all the components. State representative informed that progress is slow due to rainy season. Secretary(DWS) said the State should organized IEC campaign. State Secretary informed that AIP will be submitted within 15 days. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis.
 - ii. **Orissa:** Achievements against AIP-2012-13 objectives are low in construction of Individual household latrines. Secretary, Rural Development, Govt. of Orissa informed that action plan for convergence with MGNREGS has been prepared. On 18th October, 2012 work orders will be issued. Appeal of Chief Minister has also been released. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis.
 - iii. **Kerala :** The Cumulative Progress made by the State under NBA is very good. State has already achieved its targets under IHHLs and School toilets. State is near Nirmal Status. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis.
 - iv. **West Bengal :** The Cumulative Progress made by the State under NBA is impressive, but the Progress made by the State during the 2012-13, needs extra attention to expedite the programme implementation, State has achieved only **23%** of the IHHL-BPL and **13%** of the IHHL APL objective with an average percentage of **18%**. State representative informed that Training on SLWM has been organized with the help of Exnora Green. He also mentioned that SLWM will be taken in all the GPs identified for saturation approach. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis.
 - v. **Haryana :** The Cumulative Progress made by the State under NBA is impressive, but the Progress made by the State during the 2012-13, needs to expedite the programme implementation, State has achieved only **8%** of the IHHL-BPL and **5%** of the IHHL APL objective with an average percentage of **6%**. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that state should concentrate on SLWM. State NBA Co-ordinator informed that AIP will be submitted by end of this month.
 - vi. **Madhya Pradesh:** The Cumulative Progress made by the State under NBA is impressive, State Secretary informed that IEC activities in the state is going on. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis.

- vii. **Tamil Nadu** : The Cumulative Progress made by the State under NBA is impressive. States need to identify more GPs for Saturation to cover annual objectives. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis. Revised AIP should be submitted on priority basis. State should reduce unspent balance for further release of fund.
- viii. **Jharkhand** : Achievements against AIP-2012-13 objectives are very low in all the components except school toilets. State representative informed that progress will be registered in next 3 months. 100 villages have been taken for making ODF under CLTS approach. Secretary(DWS) said the State has very high unspent balance. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis. State Secretary informed that AIP will be submitted by 15th September, 2012. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis.
- ix. **Punjab** : Achievements against AIP-2012-13 objectives are very low in IHHLs-BPLs. State representative informed that revised AIP-2012-13 will be submitted by next week. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis. State should reduce unspent balance for further release of fund.
- x. **Rajasthan** : Achievements against AIP-2012-13 objectives are very low in all the components. State representative informed that progress will be registered in coming months. Convergence with MGNREGS has been started. Secretary(DWS) said the State has very high unspent balance. State should reduce unspent balance on priority basis to get fund. Secretary(DWS) mentioned that segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis.

Agreed Actionable Point:

- Annual Action Plans for 2012-13 should be submitted immediately
- State should reduced unspent balance on priority basis.
- States need to identify more GPs for Saturation to cover annual objectives
- Segregation of Solid Waste should be taken on priority basis
