# MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD TO DISCUSS ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION PLAN 2014-2015 UNDER NBA FOR STATE OF KERALA

- 1.1 A meeting to discuss Annual Implementation Plan 2014-2015 of State of Kerala was held at 11.30 AM on 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2014 at Conference Room of Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation. 12<sup>th</sup> Floor Paryawaran Bhawan, CGO Complex, New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Shri Saraswati Prasad, Joint Secretary (Sanitation), Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation. The list of the participants is annexed.
- 1.2 At the outset, Shri Sujoy Mojumdar, Director(NBA) said that the achievements of Kerala under TSC NBA have been commendable. State representative informed that only 19 Gram Panchayats are left to be awarded NGP. She said that State is now focusing on Solid and Liquid Waste Management. Focus is on decentralized source level treatment i.e. bio-gas plant and vermi compost units. She informed that State has prepared a detailed Communication Strategy. Director NBA) suggested that the Pulse Polio personnel may be used in IEC for NBA. Director (NBA) pointed out that all Sanitary Complexes, School toilets and Anganwadi toilets targeted for 2014-15 should be provided water supply from NRDWP funds. Handwashing facilities in Schools should also be provided funds from NRDWP. All IAY houses should be provided toilets under NBA.
- 1.3 Physical Progress: As against cumulative objectives of 9,61,831 for individual household latrines (IHHL) for BPL, 1,11,911 IHHL for APLs, 1,090 Sanitary Complexes, 3,600 for school toilets and 4,957 for Anganwadi toilets, the State has achieved 10,12,674 for individual household latrines (IHHL) for BPL, 1,43,317 IHHL for APL, 1,070 Sanitary Complexes, 3,997 for school toilets and 5,077 for Anganwadi toilets.

During 2013-14, against annual objectives of 52694 for individual household latrines (IHHL) for BPL. 0 IHHL for APLs, 142 Sanitary Complexes, 388 for school toilets and 360 for Anganwadi toilet, the State has achieved 29134 for individual household latrines (IHHL) for BPL. 434 IHHL for APL, 23 Sanitary Complexes, 288 for school toilets and 36 for Anganwadi toilets upto February, 2014.

1.4 Financial Progress: The State had an opening balance of Rs 5.80 crore as of 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2013. Fund released in 2013-14 is Rs. 21.50 Crore. The expenditure reported of Rs. 20.98 Crore.

2. State has proposed following objectives under Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) for 2014-2015 as per the modified provisions of NBA:

#### 2.1 Physical Objectives for 2014-15:

- 3. Financial Objectives for 2014-15: State has projected total requirement of Rs. 7034.38 Lakh from Central share.
- 4. The above objectives as proposed by **Kerala** were noted down for consideration subject to approval of PIP to be approved by NSSC in due course.
- 5. State was also appraised of position of toilet construction in IAY houses in the state. Against 43607 no. of houses constructed during 2012-13, toilets have been provided only for 41788 no. of houses. During 2013-14, only 39592 no. of toilets constructed out of 44096 nos of IAY houses. These should be reconciled.
- 6. Further, State has done survey in 75.66 % Gram Panchayats for Identification of Insanitary latrines. 464 Insanitary Latrines have been found the survey and out of these 196 insanitary latrines converted into sanitary latrines till date. Other in-sanitary latrines need to be converted into sanitary latrine on priority basis after identification and proper survey to comply with the Manual Scavengers act. State was requested to add IAY toilets as well as insanitary toilets including dry latrines also in the annual objectives 2014-15.
- 7. As per discussion held, State was further requested to revise some of the objectives specifically that of SEWM based on financial allocation of funds made by the Central Govt, during 2014-15 & Opening Balances as on 1st April, 2014 and upload the same in the website through online monitoring system. Hard copy of the revised AIP for 2014-15 signed by a senior officer should be sent by 8th May, 2014. District-wise AIP objectives for 2014-15 along with identified GPs should be entered on online Monitoring System. It was informed that the recommendation of PAC for 2014-15 shall be valid for this financial year only.
- 8. Tentative Allocation for 2014-15: Tentative Allocation for 2014-15 shall be finalized after progress report of all the Districts as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2014. However the actual releases during the year 2014-2015 would be subject to:
  - Approved demand of the State.
  - Availability of funds in the budget.
  - The submission of necessary documents that is UC/ASA and certificate by the State Secretary that the Districts to which funds are proposed to be released have compiled with the conditions of release and Audit reports, Utilization Certificates and Progress Reports have been received and scrutinized.
  - The State bringing down its unspent balance to reasonable levels.
  - The fund released in the first installment shall be 50% of the amount approved in the PAC and shall be reduced by the amount of opening balance in excess of 10% of the previous year's release to the State.

- 9. State was requested to accelerate the progress against all component of NBA so that to meet the physical as well as financial objectives projected by state.
- 10. ACTION POINTS: State should take note of the following:-
- (a) State has submitted the PIPs, which is under consideration.
- (b) State has focused on SLWM activities in terms of decentralized Household level systems-Biogas plants and Pipe based decomposing units. This should be preserved with.
- (c) State should also encourage the participation of "Kutumbsrees" especially in management of non -biodegradable waste. This has been indicated in certain areas and should be multiplied.
- (d) State should ensure all school and anganwadis have adequate toilets. Water supply in all such toilets should be ensured. Operation and maintenance of these toilets should be ensured.
- (e) The NGP proposals for the remaining GPs is under process. State should maintain efforts to see that all NGPs retain their status and do not slip back over time.
- (f) Regarding the setting up of CSCs. State may look at the Tamilnadu Model, O & M arrangement may also be ensured.
- (g) State should look at increasing the availability of MHM incinerators in Schools as per requirement.
