MINUTES OF THE MEETING REG. DISCUSSION ON ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2017-18 OF STATE GOVT. OF MANIPUR UNDER NATIONAL RURAL DRINKING WATER PROGRAMME (NRDWP)

The Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation has conducted an Annual Action Plan meeting for financial year 2017-18 with the officials of "Govt. of Manipur" on 08.03.2017 in Conference Room, 4th Floor, Pt. DeendayalAntyodayaBhawan, CGO Complex, New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Shri SatyabrataSahu, Joint Secretary (Water and Admn.), Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation (Gol). The list of the participants is given in Annexure.

- 7. The summary of the discussions is as follows:
- i. The Ministry informed that the Manipur would be allocated approximately the same quantum of funds under NRDWP as had been made during previous financial year (i.e. 2016-17). Manipur had been allocated Rs. 32.16 croreunder NRDWP during 2016-17. This allocation excludes the incentive for devolution of schemes under Management Devolution Index (MDI) which was Rs.8.43 crore. It was informed that the State of Manipur will be allocated tentatively Rs. 32.20 crore (excluding MDI) for NRDWP during 2017-18 as per existing guidelines. Accordingly, state was advised to revise the targets/shelf of AAP for 2017-18 as shown by the State during AAP meeting by taking into account the unspent balance available at the end of the financial year 2016-17(Closing Balance). Higher contribution of State share would be appreciated to maintain more in-flow of fund to this sector.
- ii. In his opening remarks, Joint Secretary (Water) desired that the opening balance under NRDWP should be kept within the permissible limits in order to avail funds in 2017-18 (April).
- iii. It was deliberated that the amount of allocation in 2017-18 will be scheme/ project based. The allocation made so would be utilised for the completion of the ongoing schemes in the decreasing order of the physical completion up to 25% completion (viz. 100% physically completed but financially incomplete, 75-100%, 50-75% and 25-50% physically completed water supply schemes, beyond which the schemes would be considered as

funded by state own resources. There will be no investment in new projects. However there will be exception to take up new projects in verified ODF villages, SAGY villages, Arsenic/Fluoride affected habitations. In similar order of progress of work, Manipur has proposed to cover 40 partially covered habitations with PWS and 20 habitations for augmentation during 2017-18.

- iv. Director(Water) informed that Geo-Tagging of assets is being made mandatory from the current AAP period for funds released to the state. It was requested to Geo-Tag all possible components of the pipe water supply schemes such as (i) Source, (ii) Water Treatment Plant, (iii) Storage Tanks, (iv) Stand posts, (v) Major nodes in conveying pipe network etc. EC, Manipur has stated that geo-tagging of assets has been started.
- v. It was also informed to regularly update the data in Water App and Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of the Ministry. It was also advised to update data on IMIS with immediate effect during this Yearly Data Updation period.
- vi. During deliberations, it was informed by CE, Manipur that under NRDWP, 658 schemes (607 PWS and 51 Non-PWS Schemes) are completed and 81 habitations with population of 0.79 lakh are covered with safe drinking water as on 19.02.2017.
- vii. CE, Manipurstated thatout of 3 SAGY Gram Panchayat, 01 SAGY habitation has been fully covered through PWS.
- viii. CE(WSS), Manipur stated that priority has been given to complete ongoing PWS projects and QA habitations as per decreasing order of physical completion. CE (Prog.), Manipur stated the achievement of the State in implementation of NRDWP during 2016-17 is:

- ix. The Joint Secretary (W) informed the State that, drinking water facility can be provided to Government Schools / Anganwadis up to the periphery/ boundary of Government Schools/Anganwadis from existing schemes only. No separate new schemes should be taken up.
- x. State Govt. was advised to dovetail funds under MGNREGAS/ 14th Finance Commission Grants for better O&M of Water Supply Schemes. The State was advised to implement suitable water tariff to make the scheme sustainable.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to and from the Chair.
