Minutes of the Meeting to discuss the NRDWP Annual Action Plan (2017-18) of"Meghalaya" State

1. Annual Action Plan meeting for 2017-18 with the officials of Public Health Engineering Department, Meghalaya conducted on 16.02.2017 in the Conference room, 4<sup>th</sup> floor, Pt. DeendayalAntyodayaBhawan, CGO Complex, New Delhi. The meeting was chaired by Shri SatyabrataSahu, Joint Secretary (Water), MDWS, GoI. The list of participants is given in annexure.
2. In his opening remarks, JS (W) desired that the opening balance under NRDWP should be kept within the permissible limits in order to avail funds in 2017-18 (April).
3. It was informed that the State of Meghalaya will be allocated tentatively Rs. 41.85 crores (Excluding MDI) for NRDWP during 2017-18 as per existing guidelines. State should plan targets under NRDWP keeping in view availability of nearly Rs. 170.24 crores (NRDWP 41.85 + State 111.68 + Closing Balance 16.71 -say), considering the higher expected share from the State. Accordingly, the targets should be provided for approval by the Ministry. Funding pattern for Meghalaya would be in the ratio of 90:10 between Centre and the State. Higher contribution of State share would be appreciated to maintain more in-flow of fund to this sector.
4. It was deliberated that the amount of allocation in 2017-18 will be scheme/ project based. There will be no investment in new projects. The amount will be reserved for ongoing schemes with priority in the order of 100%, 75-100%, 50-75% and 25-50% physically completed water supply schemes respectively. However there will be exception to take up new project in verified ODF SAGY villages, Arsenic/ Fluoride affected habitations. On the progress of work, State has proposed a target of 700 partially covered habitations during 2017-18.
5. Further, it was deliberated that the projects having physical progress between 0-25% will be financed from the State funds as decided by Govt. of India.
6. During 2016-17, the physical progress of schemes is given below:

7. JS (W) also deliberated that partially covered (PC) habitations having water supply between 0-25 lpcd should be given priority. The criteria for prioritizing would be as per the order mentioned in point no. 4 above. The State Secretary pointed out that there are 2784 PC habitations in this range, out of which 1 habitations has already been covered up to December, 2016 and 17 habitations will be covered by March, 2017. In 2017-18 State has proposed to cover 29 & 9 Water Quality affected (38) habitations in the category. It was also informed by the State officer that 37 other habitations having coverage between 25-100% will be covered during 2017-18. There are 3318 GPs (3969 Habitations) which are verified ODF in the State, out of this 1143 Habitations have no PWS and 2029 Habitations are Partially Covered / Quality Affected.
8. State officer pointed out that administrative approve of many schemes cleared by SLSSC are awaiting administrative approval from the State Government
9. The State was also advised to update data on IMIS with immediate effect during this Yearly Data Updation period.
10. State was advised to dovetail funds under MGNREGS/ FFC grant for better O&M of Water Supply Schemes.
11. Suitable water tariff should be collected to make the schemes sustainable.
