As you may be aware, India is a key participant in the establishment activities of two new development banking institutions, viz. BRICS New Development Bank (NDB) and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). These initiatives are likely to go a long way in meeting demand for enormous resources needed for infrastructure development, particularly, in the emerging market economies like India.

2. I am glad to share with you that Articles of AIIB have been signed on 29th June, 2015 in Beijing and the first meeting of the Board of Governors of NDB is scheduled in July, 2015. Moreover, both of these institutions are expected to be fully operational by first quarter of 2016.

3. In view of aforesaid developments, soon India would have access to additional sources of funding for meeting its needs of infrastructure financing, particularly, in sectors like Roads, Ports, Energy, Urban, Railway etc.

4. In addition, these institutions are likely to promote innovative financing products for project financing. In order to avail maximum benefit, it would thus be prudent for us to quickly develop a shelf of projects which can be taken up for financing by these institutions. While preparing shelf of projects, you may also refer to the 12th Five Year Plan document as well.

5. In respect of each of the project, kindly prepare 'Preliminary Project Proposal Report' as per attached format and details may be conveyed to DEA latest by 31st July, 2015.
