Subject: Monthly summary for the month of June 2022 in respect of Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation.

Progress in Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM)

14,64,517 households have been provided with functional household tap water connections and an amount of Rs. 1,509.64 crore has been released to the States/UTs.

Progress in Swachh Bharat Mission- Grameen Phase-II (SBM(G))

1,66,983 Individual Household Latrines (IHHLs) and 1,925 Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs) have been constructed and an amount of Rs.17.77crore has been released to the States/UTs.

Villages covered with Solid/ Liquid Waste Management & ODF Plus

7,071 village have reported to have been covered with Solid Waste Management and 7,724 villages have reported to have been covered with Liquid Waste Management, during June, 2022. Also, 9,502 villages have declared themselves ODF Plus during June, 2022.

Review of progress and implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission

A meeting was held on 8th June, 2022 at Bhubaneshwar with 13 Focus States (viz. Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal) to expedite the progress of implementation of JJM as most of the remaining tap water connections are in these States.

National Workshop on JJM.

A “National Workshop on JJM” was organised on 9-10 June, 2022 at Bhubaneshwar with Addl. Chief Secretaries/ Principal Secretaries/ Secretaries in-charge of Rural Water Supply Department/ PHED, Mission Directors and Chief Engineers JJM, for experience sharing with special emphasis on planning, time-bound implementation, quality and certification and O&M of completed works.

Review of progress and implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen)

Secretary, Ministry of Panchayati Raj and Secretary, DWS jointly reviewed the progress under SBM(G) with ACS/ Principal Secretary/ Secretary and Mission Directors in-charge of Rural Sanitation and ACS/ Principal Secretary/ Secretary in-charge of Panchayati Raj of all States/UTs on 21.6.2022, through Video Conferencing.

Review of progress of GOBARDHAN

The 3rd Meeting of the Inter-Ministerial Task Force on GOBARDHAN was held on 24th June, 2022 with representatives from MNRE, MoPNG, DST, DCAFW, DoF, ICAR, DAHD, DoRD, MoEF&CC to review the outcome/progress on the targets of all stakeholders.

A state-wise review through video conferencing was also held with 23 States/UTs (viz. Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Puducherry, Panjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal)

Review of clearances from Central Agencies for JJM works

A need was felt to assist States for expeditious clearances from Central Ministries/agencies like MoEF& CC, Railways, NHAI, GAIL, etc. For this, online mechanism has been created in which States are uploading the details of Jal Jeevan Mission schemes requiring clearances and a nodal officer has been appointed by DDWS, and on the request of Secretary, DWS, by each Central Ministry/agency involved. Secretary, MoEF&CC and Secretary, DWS jointly reviewed the status of forest clearances on 14th June with the officers of States. A similar review was held with Ministry of Railways on 29.6.2022 at the level of AS&MD, JJM.

Orientation of State Project Management Units (SPMUs) (NIC, MoPR)

Orientation of State/ District officials and State Project Management Units (SPMUs) (NIC, MoPR) on updated provisions for amending plans and its submission in Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) under 15th FC were organised through VC on 2nd& 27th to 29th June, 2022, for the States/UTs in which a total of about 3200 persons participated.

Field Visits

During 6-8 June, 2022, teams of Officers/ Consultants of DDWS undertook field visits to villages in select districts of Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand, to assess quality of ODF Plus declaration and monitor implementation of Sujalam and SLWM especially in larger villages.
